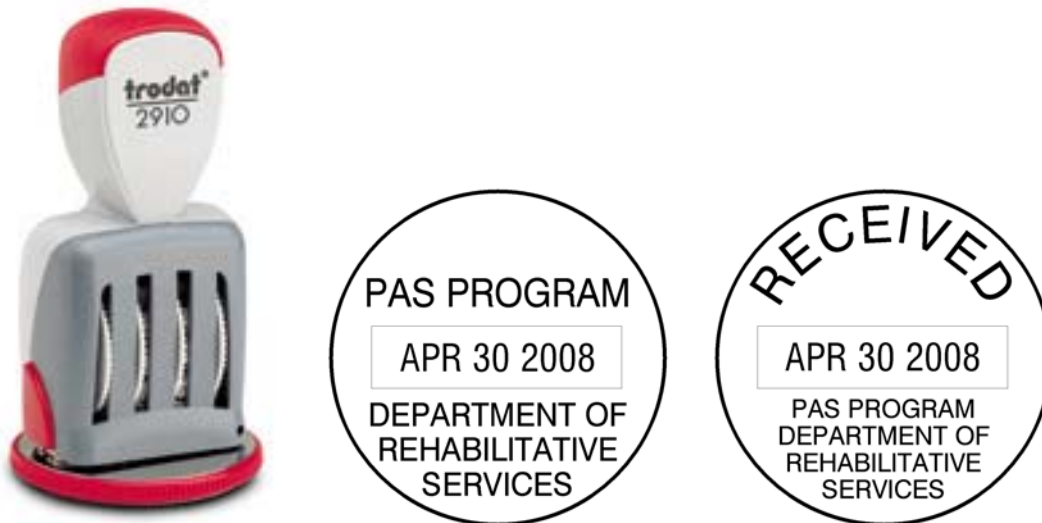


## Dater Comparison - Trodat 2910/P30 vs. Cooke #4

Here is what the older Cooke #4 dater looks like and a sample impression:



Here is what the Trodat Classic 2910-P30 dater looks like and a sample impression with two different layouts:



### Some benefits of the Trodat include:

- Does not use any inserts - no mess, no tweezers, no lost date inserts, no need to purchase year inserts each year
- Sturdier construction
- Minimum 10 year bands
- Unit is 2" in diameter as opposed to 1-3/4" for the Cook (we can size the impression down to 1-3/4" as shown in the sample but we can also make a larger 2" impression if desired or needed to accommodate additional text)
- Easier to read the date - "Apr 30 2008" on the Trodat versus "Apr 2008" plus looking for the day indicated by the arrow on the Cooke
